Gilbert and Sullivan's *Patience* is a many-splendored thing whose comedy remains relevant a century and a half after its premiere. The show holds up a fun house mirror to the convergence of the 19th-century aesthetic movement with prim Victorian ideals, and it is the audience who gets the last laugh.

Delightfully, this silly, satirical, romp of a show is also an impressive work of musical art. Contemporary reviews of the G&S operettas use terms like burlesque, extravaganza, and, less commonly, opera, and one must wonder if these creative descriptors are intended to label the pieces of Messrs. Gilbert and Sullivan as less operatic than other staged musical works of the era. Arguing with that brand of snobbery, however, is the score: reprises of the treble chorus

"Twenty love-sick maidens we" call to mind strains of Verdi (and even seem a preview to the "Humming Chorus" of Puccini's Madame Butterfly), while the prevalence of wind instruments marries Romantic orchestration with English wind band tradition. Sullivan's writing is multifaceted and bold, and Patience showcases the composer's well-read musicianship in accessible, memorable, and—yes—deliciously aesthetic ways.

Introducing our Patience Principal Cast



Dennis Yadon (Reginald Bunthorne) makes his Madison Savoyards debut but is well known to Madison audiences. He has performed many times at the Bartell, and in off-Broadway and regional theatres in numerous states. Favorite area performances include *Clue* (Wadsworth), *A New Brain* (Gordon), *Into the Woods* (Baker), *Mauritius* (Philip), and *Falsettos* (Marvin).



Cat Richmond (Patience) is an accomplished regional performer with with a "clear and gorgeous soprano" (*Broadway World*). She has appeared in a variety of productions ranging from opera to musical theatre to cabaret. Favorite operatic and musical theater roles include Lucia (*Lucia di Lammermoor*), and Die Königin der Nacht (*Die Zauberflöte*).



Mike Brady (Archibald Grosvernor) is back for his fifth consecutive season with the Savoyards, having performed as the Pirate King in *Pirates of Penzance* and Sir Roderic Murgatroyd in *Ruddigore*. Mike is an avid musical theater performer, an accomplished educator of computer science, and a ten-time state champion and two-time district champion in taekwondo.



Colleen Murphy (Lady Angela) is thrilled to appear in her first Madison Savoyards production. She received BAs in both theatre and music from Viterbo University, before most of the cast was born, and has been a frequent performer in many area community theatres. Madison audiences may remember her from the long-running *Sweet-Cannoli Nuptials* or Stage *Q's Next Fall*.



Bradley J. Carter (Colonel Calverley) made his Savoyards debut as Major-General Stanley in last year's *The Pirates of Penzance* and is excited to again portray a pattering military man whose name, like his own, is suffixed with "-ley." When not a comic baritone, Bradley sings tenor seriously with the Madison Symphony Chorus and tests lighting systems at Electronic Theatre Controls.



Jesse Harrison (Lady Saphir) is excited to be joining the Madison Savoyards once again, having been Zorah U/S in Ruddigore and Kate in Pirates of Penzance. She has also performed with Fresco Opera, Pile of Cats, Sun Prairie Civic Theatre, and Madison Theatre Guild. Jeremy Dyer (Major Murgatroyd) is excited to be joining the Madison Savoyards for his third year. Jeremy grew up in Houston, TX and spent 8 years performing with the Gilbert & Sullivan Society of Houston and Houston Savoyards choral group. Jeremy thanks his cellist parents Max and Corky who introduced him to Gilbert & Sullivan and often join him for productions playing in the orchestra.



Stephanie Frank (Lady Ella) was most recently seen in Sun Prairie Civic Theatre's productions of *Little Shop of Horrors* as Audrey II's puppeteer and the Fairy Godmother in *Cinderella*. Stephanie has performed as understudy for Queen Elizabeth I at the Bristol Renaissance Faire and has worked with numerous Madison theatre companies including Forward Theater, Four Seasons Theatre and Theatre LILA.



Roland Beach (Duke of Dunstable) has sung soprano in several Savoyards choruses (first in 2017's HMS Pinafore). He is excited to make his Savoyards tenor debut as the Duke! He is working on a classical crossover album called Corner of the Sky, chronicling the first year of finding his new voice.

Ingrid has been the primary artist for Madison Savoyards' poster designs


since 2007. Her beautiful and whimsical illustrations catch the eye and invite the viewer to read on.


Ingrid said of this year's art, "Our concept for this production of the operetta Patience, by Gilbert & Sullivan, was a romance novel cover featuring a love triangle. I took a lot of care with the facial expressions. The original was sketched in pencil, scanned in, and refined. I printed that out and transferred the image to watercolor paper. Color was added in fluid acrylic. That image was scanned and refined digitally." We used Rafaella font for the main typeface, a bold, easy-toread type with a hint of calligraphy and romance.
