
THE MADISON SAVOYARDS

When the Major-General arrives, he can dissuade the pirates only by a ruse: he tells them that he is an orphan, and so works upon their sympathies, so they let him and his wards go free.

When the pirates discover the deception that has been practiced upon them, they seize and bind the Major-General. The police come to the rescue and charge the pirates to yield, "in Queen Victoria's name." This they do. Ruth explains, however, that these pirates are all "noblemen who have gone wrong," and they are pardoned and permitted to marry the Major-General's daughters.

The Performing Arts Department of Edgewood College is pleased to assist the fine work of the Madison Savoyards in providing Gilbert & Sullivan productions for the Madison community and summer theatre for the students of the area.

Some risers & and all costumes with the exception of nightgowns, uniforms & male leads are from the Performing Arts Department of Edgewood College.

MADISON SAVOYARDS was first organized in 1963 with the production of Gilbert and Sullivan's operetta, Iolanthe.

Since that first production, the group has presented Trial by Jury, The Sorcorer, Yeoman of the Guard, The Pirates of Penzance, Princess Ida, H.M.S. Pinafore, and The Mikado.

The SAVOYARDS is a non-profit organization which is run entirely by high school and college students who take part in each production. There is a Board of Directors who are in charge of the overall running of the group. The SAVOYARDS is ensured of ongoing status because all of the profits from each show go back into the organization for the production of the following year.

Ellen Foley, the director, was the original founder of the Madison Savoyards, and participated in productions of the group from 1963 to 1968.

In 1967, she was a member of the Oberlin College Gilbert and Sullivan Players in Falmouth, Massachusetts, and in 1969, she was a key figure in G & S productions at Harvard University and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

She is currently an employee of the University of Wisconsin Physics Department.

David Crosby's experience in Gilbert and Sullivan stems from his four years in the Oberlin College Players, in Oberlin, Ohio, and at their summer home at Falmouth, Massachusetts.

Since moving to Madison in 1968, he has held numerous positions and is currently the Music Director and Conductor for the Madison Summer Symphony Orchestra.

He is presently a candidate for a Masters Degree in Music at the University of Wisconsin.
