

Some Thoughts on The Production By Bill Lutes

In the years just prior to his first collaboration with Arthur Sullivan, Gilbert's delightful series of wildly funny poems, which he called the "Bab Ballads", appeared in the weekly comic journal Fun. Scattered throughout these gems, wittily illustrated by Gilbert's own outrageous woodcuts, we find the initial appearances of many of the stories and ideas that later emerged in full flower in the Savoy operas. In one of the "Babs", "My Dream", published in the March 19, 1870, edition of Fun, Gilbert clearly defines his realm of "Topsy" Turveydom", of a universe of his own making in where, he says:

...vice is virtue---virtue vice: Where nice is nasty---nasty, nice: Where right is wrong and wrong is right---Where white is black and black is white.

Where babies, much to their surprise, Are born astonishingly wise; With every Science on their lips, And Art at All their finger-tips.

For, as their nurses dandle them, They crow binomial theorem, With views (it seems absurd to us) On differential calculus.

But through a babe, as I have said, Is born with learning in his head, He must forget it, if he can, Before he calls himself a man.

For that which we call folly here, Is wisdom in that favoured sphere; The wisdom we so highly prize Is blatant folly in their eyes. The laws of Topsy Turveydom are everywhere seen in Gilbert and Sullivan's operas, and are the source of their humor, and (paradoxically) their great truth. By looking at the world upside down, we can laugh at ourselves and our institutions and customs and neuroses, all from a safe distance. Gilbert, the social critic, and Sullivan, the gently witty singer, create for us a world in which captains say "if you please" to their sailors; where Pirates think first and foremost of matrimonial ambition when they capture young ladies; and where a Court of Justice is the last place on earth you could get a fair trial. Well, maybe that isn't so topsy turvey after all.

It is our pleasure to bring you Gilbert and Sullivan's first extant collaboration, and one of their most perfect: *Trial by Jury.* The sense of wicked fun, of great creative minds unleashed and going at full tilt, the roller-coaster-ride exuberance of this little masterpiece is as apparent today as it was in 1875, when it was first seen on a triple bill that included Offenbach's *La Perichole*, and something else, totally forgotten. The Marx Brothers-like zaniness of *Trial* is unique in the Savoy canon...there is nothing else quite like it in all of G&S, in all of musical theater, for that matter.

The rest of the program is a comucopia of delights from the three most popular G&S operas. As you watch this pageant, filled to the brim with familiar favorites performed by a wonderful assemblage of talented and dedicated people, I hope you'll raise your voice in celebration of these 40 seasons of The Madison Savoyards, and the great treasure trove of beauty and laughter they have helped to keep alive. Hurrah, hurrah, hurray!

The Argument Trial By Jury

Edwin, tiring of his sweetheart Angelina, falls in love with another; and Angelina accordingly hails him into court for breach of promise. At the rise of the curtain the Usher, while enjoining impartiality on the Jurymen, shows a definite partiality himself for the fair Plaintiff. Edwin explains that he simply happened to fall in love with another girl. Though both Jury and Judge indicate that they have similar episodes in their own past, they have little sympathy for him.

After the Jury is swom in, Angelina appears and immediately captivates all the men present. Her lawyer gives a stirring speech, and she falls sobbing on his breast.

Edwin proposes various solutions, but in vain. He offers to many her if he may many his other sweetheart later, but her lawyer objects. Edwin tries to dissuade her from wanting to many him at all, saying that when he is drunk he would beat her. The judge proposes that Edwin be made drunk to see whether he would, but her lawyer objects.

Finally, the Judge, disgusted at the objections and eager to get away, marries Angelina himself.

Music Director's Note

As music director, I am particularly excited to be conducting the premiere performance of Trial By Jury using both the new critical score and orchestral parts by Broude Brothers. Broude is in the process of editing and publishing the first critical editions of all of the extant Gilbert and Sullivan operas, proceeding in chronological order and thus commencing with Trial By Jury. (A critical edition is a version that has been edited with all of the rigors of modern musical scholarship, and one that takes into account all relevant sources.) The full and vocal scores were published a few years ago, but the parts are still being prepared. Savoyards, though special arrangement with Broude (thanks to John Krueger at Madison Music for getting the ball rolling!), is, in essence, 'beta-testing' the parts, which are essentially finished, but not proofed. After our production is complete, we will report back to Broude with detailed information about any misprints, lack of clarity, and other issues with the parts. Final revisions to the parts will then be made, based on Savoyards' report, and the parts will then be published. Working with the new parts has been both a challenge and a great opportunity for Savoyards, and we hope that the relationship with Broude can continue as subsequent operas are published.



Artistic Profiles

Bill Lutes (Stage Director) is Artist-in-Residence at the UW Madison School of Music, where he serves as vocal coach for the University Opera. He has performed as recitalist and collaborative pianist across the nation, and has appeared as soloist with the Madison Symphony Orchestra, the Wisconsin Chamber Orchestra and the Duluth-Superior Symphony. He also appears as a singing actor, particularly in the G&S operas, in which he specializes in the "patter" roles. With Savoyards he has been Bunthome in Patience. Jack Point in Yeomen of the Guard Ko-Ko in The Mikado and the Lord Chancellor in Jolanthe. He directed the 1999 production of Princess Ida. He and his wife, Martha Fischer, have presented their G&S revue Innocent Meniment around the nation. From 1987 until 1999 Bill was an on-air personality and music director of Wisconsin Public Radio, where he produced classical music programs for statewide broadcast, and helped to establish a number of award-winning outreach projects and educational programs. Last spring he returned to the international airwaves for his second stint as a panelist on the Texaco Metropolitan Opera Quiz.

David Rentz (Music Director/Orchestra Conductor) is delighted to be making his Savoyards debut this summer. A graduate of Washington University in Saint Louis and the University of Wisconsin-Madison, David is active both as a choral director and as a conductor of musical theater and opera. At Washington University, he was music director of Little Shop of Horrors and City of Angels, as well as the founding music director of More Fools than Wise, a Renaissance music group. In Madison, David has conducted groups in the UW Choral Department and Madison Children's Choir, as well as the Madison Yiddish Choir. He also served as conducting assistant and chorus master for three UW Opera productions, and produced and conducted a semi-staged performance of Purcell's Dido and Aeneas this spring.



Ann K. Baltes (Bridesmaid, Peep-Bo) is pleased to be making her third appearance with The Madison Savoyards. Other G & S roles include Kate in Yeomen of the Guard with Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, and with The Savoyards, Saccarissa in Princess Ida and in the fairy chorus of last year's Iolanthe. Other musical interests include participation in the Wisconsin Chamber Choir and directing her high school church choir. Many thanks to my supportive friends at Madison Church Supply and love to my awesome husband, Bill Rosholt, with whom I share this stage.

Michael Birkley (Associate, Major General Stanley) served as artistic director of The Madison Savoyards very first production, a staged concert version of Gilbert and Sullivan's Iolanthe thirty-nine years ago. Since returning to Madison's musical stage after a thirty-three year "work break" last November, he has appeared in CTM's A Christmas Carol (Scrooge), South Pacific (Cdr. Harbison) and Anne of Green Gables (Matthew Cuthbert), MATC's stage reading of Hat Dance (Leslie Spears) and Playwrights Ink's presentation of Betty Diamond's Let Them Eat Cake (Narrator, St. Mathew, Spencer). After 40 seasons, "It is, it is a glorious thing to be your Major General", says he.

Susannah Brooks (Bridesmaid, Isabel) recently completed her undergraduate studies in voice at UW-Madison with James Doing. At UW, she has appeared with University Opera and as a frequent soloist with Choral Union and Concert Choir. This summer marks her debut as both a bridesmaid and a bride, as she will be married in August. This is her first Savoyards production.

Paul Bushland (Jury, Boatswain, Sergeant of Police, Pish-Tush, Pooh-Bah) marks with this, his 12th production, Trial by Jury/Roses Red, with The Madison Savoyards. First appearing in The Savoyards' 1989 production of Ruddigore, Paul was most recently seen as Dick Deadeye in the 2000 production of H.M.S. Pinafore. In addition to appearing on stage, Paul was also on The Madison Savoyards' Board of Directors from 1990-1995. Paul performs with other local groups including the Madison Opera and the Madison Symphony Chorus.

Kassy Coleman (Edith, Katisha) has performed in a number of musical productions ranging from Dido in the UW School of Music production of Dido and Aeneas, to the Mother in Hansel and Gretel, and Amastre in Xerxes, both produced by the UW Opera. Kassy graduated with a BA in voice from UW LaCrosse, and is currently pursuing her master's in voice from UW Madison.

Jessica Couto Lashbrook (Bridesmaid, Josephine) has spent the majority of her career as a recitalist. Her most recent recital was an all-Schubert recital at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Her next performances, in the same venue, will be an all-French program, featuring the works of Debussy, Chausson, Hahn, and Bizet and the role of Silberklang in the one-act opera The Impressario by Mozart. This Summerville, South Carolina, native has performed in the Monday Night Concert Series (SC), the Second Sunday Music Society Recital Series, the Madison Music in Performance Series and in the Madison Unitarian Society Series. She has been a soloist with the UW-Madison's Early Music Ensemble, its opera company and scenes program, the Charleston Community Orchestra, and the Piccolo Spoleto Festival. In 2001, Ms. Lashbrook was a finalist in the Bel Canto Chorus of Milwaukee Regional Artist Competition and in 1998, she helped to premiere scenes from David Bishop's opera Esperanza. She has had the great opportunity to participate in many professional Master classes, most notably with Thomas Grubb, Davis Bishop, and Carolyn Hague. Completing her undergraduate degree work with Deanna

McBroom at the College of Charleston (SC), where she received a Bachelor of Arts degree in vocal performance, Ms. Lashbrook was given an award for the most outstanding student in the Music Department. Receiving her Master of Music degree from the UW-Madison, in 1998, Ms. Lashbrook graduated with honors and was awarded the Teaching Assistant position for the Voice Department for the academic year 1997-1998. Throughout her academic career she has received many honors and awards, including the Charles and Helen Loeb Award, the Steenbock Scholarship, the Liberace Scholarship in Music, the Lee Harwood Scholarship, and a scholarship from the STRIVE foundation. Ms. Lashbrook is currently working on her doctorate of Musical Arts in vocal performance with Ilona Kombrink at the UW-Madison. This is Jessica's first time with The Savoyards.

Rachel Renee' Cruz (Other Woman, Yum-Yum) is a second year masters student in Opera Performance at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, where she studies with Professor Mimmi Fulmer. She is performing with The Savoyards for the first time. Rachel was last seen in the UW Opera Performance of Hansel and Gretel, where she sang the role of Gretel. Upcoming in the fall Rachel will sing Eurydice in Orphee aux Enfers (Orpheus in the Underworld) for the University Opera. She teaches private voice lessons through the University and loves ballroom dancing. 
